Regatta Update - June 2009

Welcome to Brilliant Bridlington!!

Some of you will remember Bridlington, with its miles of golden sands and the safe sailing waters of Bridlington Bay, from the 2004 Regatta. The major change this year is that camping, food and sailing, will be available from the Blyth Park site. As in 2004, all safety boats will operate from the Belvedere Boat Compound so will all those bringing power boats remember to go directly to the Belvedere on Sunday 26 July no earlier than 12 noon. Sailing Programme

There will be the usual full sailing programme involving 10 points races from Monday to Friday on four separate race tracks for: Topper, Laser Full and Radial, Handicap and Rookie fleets. On Wednesday points racing gives way to three separate events: the Single Handers' Race in Toppers, the All Comers Race (a Handicap event) and the premier event of the regatta, the Mount Haes, a restricted entry, knockout competition in Xenon dinghies kindly supplied by Topper International Ltd. Entries to the Wednesday races will be through Team Managers.

Arrival/Departure - Blyth Park address is: East Farm, Wilsthorpe YO15 3QL
Arrange to arrive at Blyth Park with dinghies on Sunday afternoon. Departure will normally be after breakfast on Saturday morning. **Please make sure all competitors and staff attend the briefing on Sunday at 8.00pm. in the marquee at Blyth Park.**

Camping/Food

Six nights camping and food will be available at Blyth Park where toilets, showers, drying rooms, social areas with Tuck Shop and Staff bar, etc. will be provided. The caterers will supply breakfast, packed lunch and dinner starting on Sunday evening through to Saturday breakfast.

Evening Social Programme

Commodore's Reception at 8.00pm on Monday for Team Managers and Captains. Jim Saltonstall will be doing his famous debriefing sessions in the evenings. Also, on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings local Sports Development organisers will be running sessions on the beach involving Disc Golf, Ultimate Frisbee, cricket, volleyball and OAA activities. **Free boat trip** around Flamborough Head on Wednesday and Prizegiving/Disco/Social on Friday evening.

Cost - includes free logoed memento for each competitor and free boat trip!

Entry Fee: £110 per Single-hander, £160 per Double-hander (ie. £80 each competitor).

Camping and Food fees for either competitors or adults are: £150 per person. Camping only £60 per person. Remember competitors will need to be members of the NSSA either by being a member of an affiliated organisation or as an individual member.
